# 2 Cultivating Economic Impact

For more than five decades, IBE has served as the premier engine for the growth, sustainability, and visibility of Black-owned businesses across the state. Our commitment to economic empowerment is rooted in the belief that a thriving community requires a robust entrepreneurial ecosystem.

Black business owners often navigate a landscape fraught with limited access to capital, smaller staff sizes, and intense competition from established corporations.

In 2025, executive actions and judicial challenges created a “chilling effect” on programs designed to level the playing field, creating significant ambiguity regarding the future of minority, women, and disadvantaged business certification programs. As state agencies review and potentially restructure supplier diversity goals, Black and brown entrepreneurs face an “unknown” that threatens their ability to secure government contracts, a vital revenue stream for scaling businesses.

To counter these systemic challenges, IBE provides resources, programs, and high-level visibility for businesses. Through initiatives like the Black Business Training Institute (BBTI) and our Annual Business Conference, we provide:

## Direct Technical Assistance:

Upskilling entrepreneurs to compete in any political and economic climate.

## Strategic Networking:

Connecting small businesses with private sector partners who remain committed to diverse supply chains.

## Capital Awareness:

Providing transparency and pathways to traditional banking and alternative funding sources when traditional banking falls short.

## Capital via Growth Grants:

Providing eligible businesses with capital to enhance their operations and increase their revenue.



# Black Business Training Institute

Through the BBTI, two cohorts of **70 entrepreneurs** sharpened their foundational business skills and secured greater access to capital. The program served as a vital incubator, providing these business owners with the strategic roadmap and networking opportunities necessary to drive sustainable growth.


### Growth Grants:

## BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

### Pre/Post Test Results

- 88% of participants reported that they increased their knowledge of credit, SBA lending and other loan and financing opportunities, and the importance of banking relationships
- 70% of cohort participants better understand available technology that may aid in efficiency, customer satisfaction and business growth
- 76% of participants are now aware of and understand the procurement opportunities in Indiana
- 73% of the participants currently feel that they have enhanced their skills in operations, finance, banking, networking, marketing and sales, customer service and human resources
- 70% of participants reported that they better understood how to read financial statements, cash flow and sales projections and related documentation

# Special 2025 Events

## Melanin Table Talk: State of the Black Community

In partnership with the Let Them Talk Coalition, IBE hosted the 2nd Annual Melanin Table Talk on April 23, 2025. This initiative serves as a sophisticated, data-driven engine for dismantling the systemic barriers facing Black youth and families. By convening **176 high-level stakeholders**—including policymakers, educators, and parents—the event moved beyond discussion to the development of actionable frameworks for mental health, educational equity, and violence prevention. To maximize this impact, the initiative was integrated into the IBE Statewide Conference, empowering all **12 IBE chapters** to lead these critical community solutions in every corner of Indiana.

## College Matters: Equipping Parents for Success

On October 23, 2025, IBE hosted **College Matters: Equipping Parents for Success – “Blueprints and Brunch: Building FAFSA Ready Parents.”** This strategic financial aid initiative was designed to demystify the complexities of post-secondary funding for families. In collaboration with eight community partners and local school systems, IBE provided expert-led workshops that translated the FAFSA process, scholarship identification, and the nuances of financial award letters into actionable steps. By dismantling information barriers, we empowered parents to serve as informed advocates for their children’s academic and financial futures.



# Providing Access to Critical Healthcare for Our Community

IBE prioritizes health equity as a cornerstone of our work, directly addressing the significant disparities that impact the well-being of African Americans and those underserved in our communities. Through dedicated resources and community support, we are transforming lifestyles and working tirelessly to ensure every individual has the opportunity to thrive.



## The Indiana Health Fair

Addressing health equity is a cornerstone of our mission. Last year, IBE's Health Fair delivered **4,409 free screenings** to our community—providing access to care that carries a fair market value of **\$4,000 per participant**. This means that for every person who walked through our doors, IBE's partners provided access to **\$4,000 worth of clinical-grade screenings**, risk assessments, and immunizations they would have otherwise had to fund out-of-pocket. By removing this massive financial barrier, we generated a total community healthcare impact of **more than \$17 million**. This targeted investment focuses on the early detection of chronic conditions—such as diabetes and hypertension—directly dismantling the systemic health disparities that disproportionately affect Black, Brown and underserved families.

## Mental Health Symposium

### Cherish Your Mind: Understanding the Importance of Brain Health

*Cherish Your Mind* is one of IBE's most recent initiatives, bridging the gap between clinical science and community wellness. Through our high-impact Mental Health Symposium on Saturday, July 19, and a city-wide public awareness campaign, we empowered the Black community in Indianapolis to prioritize brain health and mental resilience.

Our sessions go beyond theory, providing practical strategies for **self-care, stress reduction, and boundary-setting**, while ensuring families know how to access essential community resources.

A powerhouse panel of advocates and experts, including actress and author Holly Robinson-Peete, former NBA player Greg Oden, NAMI Indiana Executive Director Barbara Thompson, and Dr. Dwight Holland, amplified last year's mission. Together, they helped normalize the conversation around mental wellness and provided our community with the tools to maintain optimal brain health for a lifetime.

## Cherish Your Mind: The Student-Athlete Edition

On September 25, IBE hosted Cherish Your Mind: Understanding the Importance of Brain Health—Student-Athlete Edition at Warren Central High School. This youth-focused symposium brought together **over 200 student-athletes** for an urgent and honest dialogue about the intersection of mental health, identity, and the intense pressures inherent in competitive sports.

Through a blend of visual storytelling, guided discussions, and reflective activities, the program challenged the “strength-at-all-costs” narrative. We highlighted a critical truth: even students who appear confident and successful on the field may be silently navigating stress, anxiety, or self-doubt. By fostering a safe environment, IBE empowered these young leaders to prioritize their emotional well-being alongside their physical performance.

The symposium was moderated by Olivia West (In-Game Host for the Indiana Pacers and Fever), who facilitated a high-level exchange between the students and a distinguished panel of experts and athletes:

- **Dr. Russell Ledet:** A physician-scientist and triple-board resident psychiatrist specializing in pediatric and adolescent mental health.
- **Antoine Bethea:** NFL Champion, community leader, and former Indianapolis Colt.
- **Greg Oden:** Former NBA No. 1 draft pick and legendary Lawrence North High School standout.
- **Richard Dixon:** Program Director for NAMI Indiana.

By connecting these high-profile role models with our youth, the objective was to provide a lifeline of support and a roadmap for maintaining mental resilience in the face of public and personal pressure.



# Health & Wellness Sports Pavilion

IBE's Health and Wellness Sports Pavilion, a vibrant, three-day hub of activity, took place from July 18–20 at the Indiana Convention Center. The Pavilion attracted **1,146 attendees**.

The Pavilion served as a center for community engagement, offering a diverse slate of programming that blended athletic competition with essential life skills. These featured activities provided a platform for participants of all ages to showcase their talents, strengthen family ties, and access vital wellness resources.

## YOUTH ATHLETICS & MENTORSHIP



### **Father Knows Best Basketball Clinic:**

Presented by the Allan Houston Legacy Foundation & FISLL, this clinic used the game of basketball to strengthen the bond between 25 fathers and their daughters. Featuring WNBA players and community mentors, the event focused on "The Huddle"—a space for heart-to-heart chats on leadership and life.

### **Indy Premiere League & LNO/Hamp Summer League:**

These tournaments brought together hundreds of rising stars from 4th grade through high school. Beyond the thrill of competition, the leagues fostered teamwork and confidence, connecting athletes and their families with ambassadors sharing resources on health and mentorship.

These gatherings generated a massive economic footprint for Indianapolis while providing a vital stage where our community is seen, heard, and celebrated nationally.



## Cultural Arts Pavilion

The Cultural Arts Pavilion serves as the creative soul of our Summer Celebration. Themed *Court Vision: The Art of Resilience and Excellence in 2025*, the pavilion featured a special art exhibition celebrating the power of women and girls and highlighted the stories of athletes, artists, and change makers who have pushed boundaries, broken barriers, and redefined excellence. Through the Art Speaks Café and immersive gallery exhibitions, we provided a high-visibility platform for **33 Black artists**.

The Cherish Your Mind exhibit featured a public awareness campaign designed to educate the Black community on brain health and wellness. Faces of Mental Health was a powerful art exhibit that challenged assumptions and invited deeper understanding by revealing a simple truth: mental health struggles were often invisible. Through a collection of portraits, the exhibit presented individuals of different ages, cultures, professions, and life experiences and reminded audiences that mental health does not have a “look.”






# 2025 By the Numbers
